TP begins site survey

TP returns to site

Sound-producing operations at site by TP cease

Le Centre de Surveillance des Pêches reports a fishing boat captured 30 tons sharks

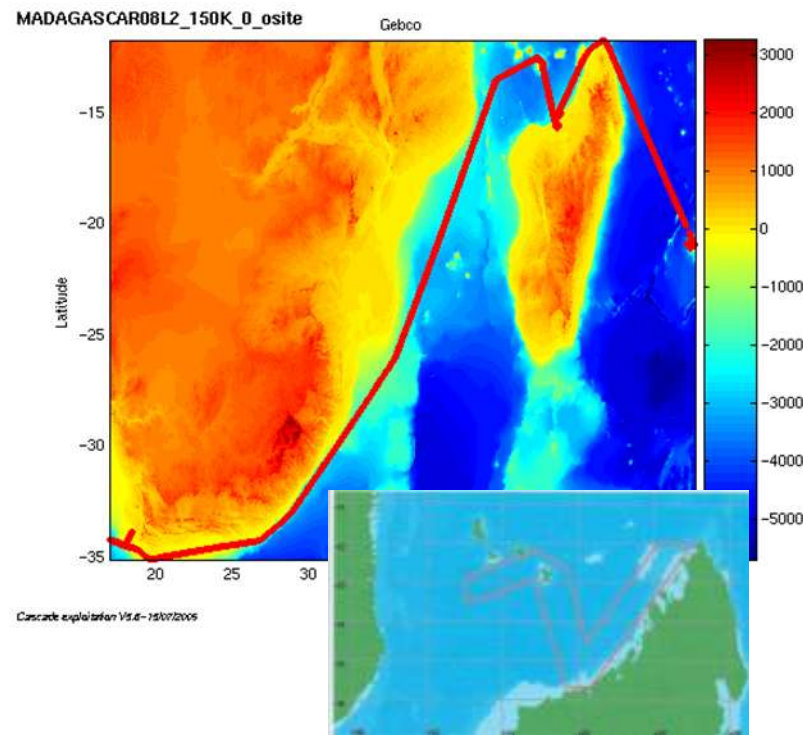

MBES ON

Approximately 100 melon-headed whales observed at Antsohihy

Initial reports of stranding event internationally

Government approves international Mass Stranding Response Team (MSRT)

MSRT starts work
