

**SPAIN. PROGRESS REPORT ON CETACEAN RESEARCH, MAY 2001 TO MARCH 2002, WITH
STATISTICAL DATA FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR 2001**

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This report summarises information obtained from: Institute of Technology, Fisheries and Food of the Basque Country (AZTI). Marine Animal Rescue Centre of Catalunya (CRAM). Department of Animal Biology (Marine Sciences). Faculty of Biology. La Laguna University (Canary Is.) (ULL). Tenerife Conservation (TC). GRAMPUS and SECEM. Department of Animal Biology of the University of Valencia (UV). Spanish Institute of Oceanography of the Ministry of Science and Technology (IEO).

2. Sightings data

2.1 Field work

2.1.1 SYSTEMATIC

Aerial sighting surveys, sponsored by the Ministry of Environment, are being made since 2000 to estimate relative abundance of cetaceans along the waters of Valencia and Murcia. (UV).

Surveys from the "Monachus" boat are being carried out around the Canary Is. (TC).

2.1.2 OPPORTUNISTIC, PLATFORMS OF OPPORTUNITY

Opportunistic observations were carried out during transects for red tides monitoring in the Galician rías and fishing and oceanographic surveys along the Mediterranean coast (IEO).

Opportunistic observations are made in the Catalonian mediterranean coast by the Sea Civil Guard and reported to the CRAM.

Whale watching boats are used occasionally as platforms of opportunity off the SW coast of Tenerife (ULL).

8. Strandings

Different organizations and institutions collect information on strandings along the Spanish coasts. In the Mediterranean: Marine Animals Recuperation Centre of Catalunya (CRAM) and the University of Valencia (UV). In the Atlantic: GRAMPUS, CEMMA, SGHN, UO, MMC, IEO.

9. Other studies and analyses

Observers to monitor fishing fleets from the Basque Country also collected information on incidental catches of cetaceans. In 2001 no incidental catches were reported in neither of the following fisheries: traditional trawl in ICES areas VIII a, b, d (330 hauls observed), pair trawl in areas VIII a, b, d and VII (250 hauls) and gillnet in area VIII c (12 fishing trips). (AZTI).

Incidental catches of cetaceans were monitored in different long distance Spanish fishing fleets. Observer's schemes were in operation in the trawl fisheries in the SW Atlantic, NAFO and Svalbard areas (1858, 1159, 323 hauls observed respectively) as well as in Hatton Bank (786 hauls) and Reikjanes Ridge (174 hauls). The longline fishery for swordfish was also monitored in the Atlantic and Indian Oceans (356 and 106 sets respectively). Observer's reporting schemes were also in operation in the tuna longline, trawl and purse seine fishing fleets in the Mediterranean. Observers collected information on incidental catches and sightings of cetaceans in experimental longline fishing surveys carried out in the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans (IEO).

Compliance with the whale watching guidelines in Tenerife were monitored and acoustic studies of whale watching boats were carried out by the ULL.

Food habits studies in cetaceans from the Gulf of Cadiz are being carried out by GRAMPUS and SECEM.
