

**SPAIN. PROGRESS REPORT ON CETACEAN RESEARCH, APRIL 2002 TO APRIL 2003, WITH STATISTICAL DATA FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR 2002**

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This report summarises information obtained from: Centre for the Recuperation of Endangered Marine Species of Andalucía (CREMA). GRAMPUS/SECEM. Ministry of the Environment (ME). Spanish Institute of Oceanography, of the Ministry of Science and Technology (IEO).

**2.1.2 OPPORTUNISTIC, PLATFORMS OF OPPORTUNITY**

After the "Prestige" oil spill accident (13/11/2002) opportunistic sightings were conducted during multipurposes oceanographic surveys along the Galician continental shelf (NW Spain). Between 7 and 22 December 2002, a 12 days journey was completed. The searching effort covered a total of 644 nautical miles. Eleven sightings of cetaceans were made. The only species identified was the common dolphin (7 observations). The animals sighted were showing a normal behaviour and no dead or oiled specimens were found (Lens, 2003) (IEO).

A solitary humpback whale was observed during February and March 2003, for at least 40 days, wandering around in several Galician rías. The whale was sighted and photographed on many occasions, showing the typical behaviour of the species. At down was normally seen in the vicinity of docks, where abundant biomass of grey mullets exist. This is the first recorded coastal sighting of a humpback whale in the Atlantic Spanish peninsular coast (IEO).

Opportunistic cetacean observations were carried out during transects for red tides monitoring in the Galician rías (IEO).

## **8. Strandings**

Different organizations and institutions collect information on strandings along the Spanish coasts. In the Mediterranean: Marine Animals Recuperation Centre of Catalunya (CRAM), University of Valencia (UV) and Centre for the Recuperation of Endangered Marine Species of Andalucía (CREMA). In the Atlantic: GRAMPUS, CEMMA, SGHN, UO, MMC, IEO.

## **9. Other studies and analyses**

A project oriented to the conservation of the bottlenose dolphin was finished in July 2002. The populations of this species were studied as well as the interactions with the fisheries resources. The main lines of the project were the improvement of the sensitiveness of the fishing sector, development of systems to diminish competence between fishers and dolphins, determine population structure and rate of mixing between subpopulations and elaborate guidelines for a possible Conservation or Recuperation Plan (ME).

Up until now 46 “Sites of Community Importance” to protect the bottlenose populations in areas of Galicia, Ceuta, Murcia, Valencia, Catalauña and the Balearic Islands have been proposed to the European Commission to be part of Natura 2000. Another 5 “Sites of Community Importance” to protect the populations of harbour porpoises in Ceuta and Galicia have also been proposed (ME).

Incidental catches of cetaceans were monitored in different long distance Spanish fishing fleets. Observer's schemes were in operation in the trawl fisheries in the SW Atlantic, NAFO and Svalbard areas (355, 1094, 403 hauls observed respectively) as well as in Hatton Bank (483 hauls) and Reikjanes Ridge (117 hauls). The longline fishery for swordfish was also monitored in the Atlantic, Pacific and Indian Oceans (163, 87 and 99 sets respectively). Observers collected information on incidental catches and sightings of cetaceans in experimental longline fishing surveys carried out in the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans. (IEO).

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
